

ABOUT

The Mayor's Arts Awards are the most prestigious honors conferred by the District on individual artists, teachers and nonprofit organizations. The DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities (CAH) will present the 32nd Annual Mayor's Arts Awards at the Historic Lincoln Theatre in September 2017.

Nominations for individuals and organizations are being accepted for awards in the following categories:

- Excellence in Visual Arts
- Excellence in Performing Arts
- Excellence in Arts Education
- Excellence in Creative Industries
- Excellence in the Humanities
- The Larry Neal Writers' Award for Adults and Youth

GUIDELINES

- The awards are limited to individuals who reside and nonprofit organizations that have administrative offices in the District of Columbia.
- Individuals and nonprofit organizations may self-nominate or be nominated for an award.
- Individuals and nonprofit organizations may be nominated in multiple award categories where appropriate.
- Separate applications are required for each nomination category.
- Individuals and nonprofit organizations cannot be nominated in a category that they have been awarded in for a period of at least 2 years.

DEADLINE

Only online applications will be accepted and must be submitted no later than Friday, **February 24**, **2017**, **4:00PM (EST)**.

HOW TO NOMINATE

Those making nominations (herein "applicant/s OR application") are required to create an account through the website Good Done Great (GDG) in order to submit a nomination for an award. There is no cost for this. The website link may be accessed via http://bit.do/MAA2017, or by visiting www.dcarts.dc.gov. Please be advised that upon visiting the application portal link, applicants will encounter "Guide to Grants" page Select "Sign Up Today" link and proceed to the Mayor's Arts Award nomination application. New users will be required to create a log in account. Complete the nomination application by the deadline.

ADULT:		
FICTION	: One unpublished short story, not to exceed 3,000 words, double-spaced	
DRAMATIC WRITING	 One unproduced double-spaced play or double-spaced screen play. All plays and screen plays must include a two-page contextualizing the selection submitted. Entries will be judged on the summary and maximum of 3,000 words submitted 	
POETRY	: One poetry application must contain three (3) unpublished poems (one poem per page). The applicant will be judged on the quality of all three submissions.	
TEEN (GRADES 9-12):		
POETRY	: Two unpublished poems (one poem per page).	
FICTION	: One unpublished short story, not to exceed 500 words, double-spaced.	

WORK SAMPLES

CAH values and emphasizes artistic excellence or creative content in all programs within all disciplines. This section contains detailed information on the CAH's requirements and suggestions regarding artistic content.

Arts and humanities content and/or merit is one of several criteria on which an application is reviewed. Other criteria include: District impact and engagement, artistic expertise and history as dictated within the program guidelines. Arts and humanities content and/or merit are demonstrated to the Advisory Review Panel through the applicant's:

- Section 1 Work sample;
- Section 2 Support materials;
- Section 3 Résumé(s) of key personnel; and bios

Of these, the work sample carries the most weight because it must contain the clearest depiction of the nominee's best work(s) of art and/or humanities. All applicants must submit arts and/or humanities work samples.

Work samples are a critical to each application and are carefully considered during application review. The CAH strongly recommends that applicants pay close attention to the content of work sample submissions.

The guidelines on what to submit within a work sample submission depend on the applicant's arts and/or humanities discipline. *Applicants must adhere to the work sample requirements below in order to be eligible for consideration.*

Arts Education	
	Includes video and audio excerpts, writing samples, and student art work along with syllabi, lesson plans, and other materials created by teaching artists and teachers in professional development projects.
	Educational materials are also acceptable alongside the artistic work sample.
Crafts	
	Individuals - Submit digital images of ten different works.
	Organizations - Submit 20 digital images of different works.
	Create an Image Identification List of the images being submitting. Arrange the list in the order of viewing preference. Title the page with the words "Image Identification List" and the applicant's name. For each image, include the artist's name, artwork title, medium, size and the year the work was completed. Digital images must be numbered to correspond with the Image Identification List.

Applicants are strongly encouraged contact the nominee to obtain the most up to date nomination materials for the nomination uploads.

	Submit up to two video recordings of performances.
	Submit an ensemble selection unless the nominee a soloist or the project involves a solo.
Design Arts	
	Individuals - Submit digital images of ten different works.
	Organizations - Submit 20 digital images of different works.
	Create an Image Identification List of the images being submitting. Arrange the list in the order of viewing preference. Title the page with the words "Image Identification List" and the applicant's name. For each image, include the artist's name, artwork title, medium, size and the year the work was completed. Digital images must be numbered to correspond with the Image Identification List.
Interdisciplinary	
	Individuals and organizations must submit up to 10 digital images or up to two audio/video recordings demonstrating the integration of disciplines in the work.
Media Arts	
Film, Video, Radio	Submit up to two audio/video recordings of completed work or work-in-progress.
Multi-disciplinary	
	Provide the required work samples (as described herein) for two (minimum) or three (maximum) of the artistic disciplines that are relevant to the grant request.
Music	
	Submit up to three audio/video recordings.
	Selections must not exceed five minutes.
	Upload each selection in a separate file.
Photography	
	Individuals - Submit digital images of ten different works.
	Organizations - Submit 20 digital images of different works.

	Create an Image Identification List of the images being submitting. Arrange the list in the order of viewing preference. Title the page with the words "Image Identification List" and the applicant's name. For each image, include the artist's name, artwork title, medium, size and the year the work was completed. Digital images must be numbered to correspond with the Image Identification List.
Theatre	
Actors	Submit video recordings of two contrasting monologues.
	Still images of productions are prohibited.
Directors	Submit a copy of a 1-3 page concept statement of a recently directed play.
Organizations	Submit up to two video recordings of performances.
	Digital images of productions are prohibited.
	Playbills and programs are prohibited as work samples. However, they may be included as support material.
Playwrights	See LITERATURE, above.
Sound Designers	Submit up to three audio recordings.
Visual Arts	
	Individuals - Submit digital images of ten different works.
	Organizations - Submit 20 digital images of different works.
	Create an Image Identification List of the images being submitting. Arrange the list in the order of viewing preference. Title the page with the words "Image Identification List" and the applicant's name. For each image, include the artist's name, artwork title, medium, size and the year the work was completed. Digital images must be numbered to correspond with the Image Identification List.
Arts Teaching	
	Submit Syllabi, lesson plans, rubrics and evaluation methods.

SCORING RUBRIC

Panelist will score each category on a scale of 1 - 5 with 1 being the lowest and 5 being the highest.

<u>5</u> -Highest Score	
	Nominee fully embodies all the qualities described in the description of the award.
4 - 2 nd Highest	
	Nominee embodies the qualities described in the description of the award with a minor hesitation and/or question about either quality of work OR level of community impact OR overall nomination package.
<u>3</u> - Mid-Range	
	Nominee somewhat embodied the qualities described in the description of the award but there was hesitation in one or two areas such as artistic quality AND impact on the community or the quality of the nominee's application AND the level of impact.
<u>2</u> –Low Range	
	Nominee somewhat embodied the qualities described in the award but there was significant hesitation toward even giving a mid-range nomination for perhaps any and all of the qualities mentioned in the award description.
<u>1</u> -Lowest Range	I
	Nominee has reason to be considered for an award based on fundamental criteria described in the award description but there is little reason to recommend the nominee strongly for the award being considered

Nominee shows commitment in development of craft.
20%	COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND IMPACT
	 Nominee describes significant impact within the DC community. Arts activities are enriching experiences that meet the unique needs of DC residents. Nominee is clear about the target audience and appropriate marketing methods to target audiences. Nominee partners with similar/complementary organizations and individuals to leverage resources, where appropriate.
