



## Conflict of Interest Statement

As a Commissioner on the District of Columbia Commission on the Arts and Humanities (“CAH”), you hold a position of public trust and therefore must uphold the highest standards of ethical and professional behavior regarding the treatment of any actual, apparent, or potential conflicts of interest. As a result, you are required to disclose the existence of any actual, apparent, or potential conflicts of interest to the Chairperson by the first meeting of the Commission of the new fiscal year.

An appearance of a conflict of interest would arise when the commissioner, any member of the commissioner’s immediate family, the commissioner’s partner; or an organization that employs, or is about to employ, any of the aforementioned individuals, has a financial or personal interest in the Individuals or Organizations selected for grants, sub-grants, or contracts issued by CAH or any other business relationship with CAH.

Other relationship(s), such as close personal friendship, that you think might affect your judgment or be seen as doing so by a reasonable person familiar with the relationship may also cause a conflict of interest.
