DC COMMISSION RARTS & HUMANITIES GRANTS COMMITTEE REPORT Gretchen, Committee Chair

On Thursday, January 18th the grants committee convened to decide the next steps for recommendations that came from the Grants Revamp meeting.

From those recommendations, the committee voted to bring the following recommendations for a vote to the full commission:

- Expanding the General Operating Support Grant to include first-time applicants removing the prior grant requirement.
- Opening several grant programs in late-February 2024 to help spread the application and paneling process over a longer period. This would ultimately help applicants applying for multiple grants and staff with workflow balance.

> <u>Considerations / Decisions</u>

• FY25 GOS Recommendation

Currently GOS offers two cohorts:

GOS Generalists:

Organizations whose primary purpose is to present and or produce arts and humanities experiences for residents of the District of Colombia. *This program requires applicants to have been previously award a competitive CAH award*.

GOS Service Organizations:

Organizations whose primary mission is to provide specialized services which can include professional development, technical assistance, shared operational services, and/ or research to DC-based arts and humanities organizations. *This program requires applicants to have been previously award a competitive CAH award.*

The committee recommends expanding the General Operating Support grant to include a third cohort GOS Capacity Building. This cohort will support small arts and humanities organizations that have not previously been awarded a grant by CAH. Capacity Building needs can include but are not limited to staff training, longer organizational initiatives, sector-strengthening that increases access and awareness of programs for the DC community. The cohort will not require a previous CAH award providing a true GOS on-ramp for new applicants or those not previously funded.

Beyond funding, the program offers additional features to foster connections and knowledge exchange:

- Peer mentoring: Connect with experienced arts and humanities leaders for additional guidance and support.
- Quarterly convenings: Network and share learnings with other cohort members, building a collaborative community.
- The committee is currently reviewing a two-year funding model for all GOS Cohorts
- Decision: Yes (Grants Committee Recommendation: 1/18/24)

• FY25 Adjusted Grant Opening Cycle Recommendation

- The grants committee recommends moving the opening of three grant programs from their traditional launch date in May to earlier in February.
- The following grants are proposed for a February Launch:
 - FY25 General Operating Support (GOS)
 - FY25 Projects, Events or Festivals, Individuals (PEFi)
 - FY25 Projects, Events or Festivals, Organizations (PEFo)
 - FY25 East Arts (EA)
- Grants that will continue to launch during the summer starting in May:
 - FY25 Arts and Humanities Education Project Grant (AHEP)
 - FY25 Field Trip Experiences (FTE)
 - FY25 Arts and Humanities Fellowship Program (AHFP)
 - FY25 Capital Projects (CP)
- The benefits of the change include the following:
 - Reduces the number of panels during the summer.
 - o Allows collection of required documents earlier in the cycle
 - Balances the workload more evenly for grant managers.

Decision: Yes (Grants Committee Recommendation: 1/18/24)

Committee Recommendations

- 1. Resolved, that the commission agree to the Committee's recommendation to expand the GOS Grant Program to include a third cohort GOS Capacity Building for FY2025 General Operating Support.
- **2.** Resolved, that the commission agree to the committee's recommendation to launch the following FY2025 Grants in February 2025: PEFi, PEFo, and EA
