Grant Program Description:

JEG provides support for District-based artists to exhibit their work in a juried, themed visual art exhibition through grant awards and the use of CAH's exhibition space located in the lobby of 200 I Street, SE.

Legacy: Civil Rights at 60

Marks the inaugural exhibition in the 200 I Street Galleries dedicated to topics on social justice during the period between Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday weekend and Black History Month. This space is intended to celebrate and reflect on Dr. King's "Beloved Community" and Black History Month. The focus of this exhibition is on the legacy and impact of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 during its 60th year anniversary in 2024.

The exhibition provides insight into the progress, challenges, and ongoing efforts towards achieving equity and social justice through four core themes of 1) People and Icons, 2) Basin for Protests, 3) Matters and Materials; and 4) Back to the Future.

There were 49 applications, 27 artists were selected and 50 artworks on view representing a range of mediums including photography, sculpture, painting, graphic design, collage, prints and documentary filmmaking. Staff also supported this exhibition with a curated video featuring Mahila Jackson singing before Dr. King's speech at the March on Washington (1963), excerpts of Dr. King's "I Have a Dream Speech", and excerpts of the press conference of President Johnson signing the Civil Rights Act of 1964. There also was a curated soundtrack on the "Music of the Movement".
