Grant Program Description:

GOS offers general operating support to non-profit arts, humanities, and arts education organizations whose primary mission focus is in one or more of the following areas: dance, design, folk and traditional arts, fiction and non-fiction writing, media arts, music, theatre, or visual arts. The mission, as submitted on the organization's most-recent IRS Form 990, must include the word(s) arts, humanities, and/or arts or humanities discipline. More than 51% of both the organization's previous year's cash expenses and programming/services must be devoted to the arts and humanities and/or arts education.

Context

1. Fund All Eligible Applicants

In the December 19, 2022, commission meeting, the Grants Committee proposed a resolution to fund all eligible GOS applications to the FY 2024 cycle. The resolution passed.

2. DC-based Arts and Humanities Budgets versus Total Organizational Budgets

(A) There are some GOS recipients that are not arts and humanities organizations, but who have substantial arts programs or organizations that are arts and humanities organizations, but whose programming is not located solely in DC.



For the past three years we have asked a nuanced budget question to determine how much of an organization's total cash expenses were dedicated to the arts and humanities in DC. Last year, the commission decided to base funding amounts on this DC-based arts and humanities number, rather than the overall budget number. Organizations are still paneled in cohorts based on their overall budget size.

(B) In this year's Budget Support Act (BSA) legislation, Council further qualified the question in (A) above:

(i) Organizations < \$115,000 are not restricted in the size of their award.
(ii) Organizations > \$115,000 may not receive an award that is more than 50% of their budget.

(iii) Organization size is based on the Total District-based arts and humanities cash expenses, less any sources of District government grants or contracts.

The above cohorts represent the 10 panels that took place in April 2023. The groups are slightly different to those of last year as (a) budgets have fluctuated and (b) there is a greater number of applicants in the pool. We've tried to mirror last year's funding ranges as closely as possible. **Decision:**

The Grants Committee approved the funding ranges for FY24 GOS awards (August 18, 2023). Full Commission approved the funding ranges for FY24 GOS awards (August 21, 2023).

4. Other Considerations

- Donut Hole: Because of the new BSA legislation, organizations with budgets <> \$115K and approximately \$240K will see a decrease in their awards for FY24 as they are capped at an award of no more than 50%. This impacts 12 organizations (organizations tagged in blue).
- **Guard Rails:** There are some fluctuations to organizations' budgets as they emerge from the pandemic, so sticking rigidly to the ranking formula may cause a sharp decrease or increase in funding.

Decision:

The Grants Committee (August 18, 2023) and Full Commission (August 21, 2023) recommended capping any decrease or increase to FY24 awards to \$10,000 of current year awards (except for those organizations restricted by the BSA).

Award Recommendation (September 27, 2023)

To fund 171 eligible organizations in the amount of \$19,223,754

In FY24 a proposed flattened award was implemented, allocating the same award amount for all applicants who passed first round review scoring. This is part of an increased effort to improve equity in funding. Outreach this year included town halls prior to the release of the grant request for applications, workshops for applicants, weekly live chats for additional applicant support, a library outreach series, and additional promotional events in collaboration with the Communications team to share the opportunity with the community.

The lowest scoring applicants across the entire program we submitted to a second round of review, with a new panelist cohort. This review was intended to provide additional feedback for applicants, as well as determine if applicants should be funded, or needed additional outreach from Commission staff to better prepare their applications. Applicants who were decided to not be ready for funding this year



from this panel will receive focused communication from the grant managers with the intent of improving their application for next year's funding cycle.

Rationale
