4 STEPS TO OBTAINING A BASIC BUSINESS LICENSE

Step 1:

Corporate Registration \checkmark If operating as a corporate entity (corporation, limited liability company, or partnership).

Trade Name Registration \checkmark If planning to use a fictitious or shortened version of the corporate name when conducting business. Visit corponline.dcra.dc.gov.

Step 2:

Registration with Internal Revenue Service and DC Office of Tax and Revenue

Step 3:

Registration with Office of the Zoning Administrator

- Certificate of Occupancy (COO): If operating out of an office occupancy-zoning.
- Home Occupation Permit (HOP): If conducting business out of a permits.
