Artist Statement: Early in my development as an artist I decided to break down the human form into basic geometric shapes and lean on expressing my characters' emotions through abstracted exaggerated placements of their facial features and body parts. My signature gray Frocasian characters were inspired by my interracial marriage. My husband was born to a Swedish mother and an African American father in Sweden, and while we both grew up in the same town and went to the same

school, our life experience has been different due to the color of our skin. Society has a long way to go to become inclusive, equal, and to appreciate our diversity and recognize our joint humanity and this is one reason why I have spent most of my career investigating social justice issues. My first artist love was Frida Kahlo and her unapologetic storytelling and how she challenged social norms. I fell in love with the bold black outlines of Keith Haring's work, the striking collages by Romare Bearden and the organic structures of Antoni Gaudí. These artists have served as an inspiration for the development of my own artistic style in which I combine multiple mediums onto canvas.

Sondra N. Arkin

Artist Statement: Sondra N. Arkin's work draws from both urban and natural environments using micro- and macro-perspectives to elude discernable points of identification. As such, the work often strikes viewers as familiar but not particularly specific. The paintings have been described as containing forms that lay "suspended just below the surface," and that is the intent. Whether painting or creating sculptural installations, the artist uses transparency to force the viewer to look beyond the obvious.

Our relationship with what is all around us, but cannot be seen, what we fail to notice, and what hides in plain sight, is central to the work; and how we relate to other entities always focuses on connections and boundaries. The work advances ideas of ecological stewardship and individual responsibility by asking for a close examination of what is around us.

The wax and ink panels illuminate what is contained in the atmosphere, while sculptures use repurposed materials, often single use plastics. It is impossible to respect our relationships without acknowledging the fragility of life itself. Ultimately, the artist is concerned with the impact that we have on this planet in the short time that we are alive. We bear a responsibility to move through this world with a whisper, as respectful guests would, using our knowledge to nurture the world in which we live.

Sophia McCrocklin

Discipline: Fiber Artist Statement:

Sophia's large-scale fiber sculptures depict leaves, seeds, and small plants prevalent in Rock Creek Park's understory. Her work shows the "Faces of the Forest" battling climate change to keep the forest intact and vibrant. The sculptures are created with white Dacron that is cut, hand- and machine-sewn, supported internally with copper wire, and painted with acrylic paint. The pieces express the grandeur of the forest by magnifying the specimens up to 15 times their original size. This enlargement enables viewers to better see these important, silent "players" in the ecosystem. For millennia, forests have provided clean air to breathe by filtering out toxins and providing oxygen, along with shade from the summer heat. Now, Sophia urges, it is our turn to help the forest.
