Activities may be projects that include, but are not limited to: dance, design, folk and traditional arts, literature, media arts, music, theater, and visual arts.

AMOUNT: up to \$500,000 for new facility purchase

up to \$250,000 for other eligible projects

MATCH: Awards greater than \$100,000 require a 1:1 cash

award match

Awards \$100,000 and less do not require a match

APPLICATION WINDOW: June 6 - July 15 at 10 pm

PURPOSE: Supports qualified organizations seeking permanent property or equipment, or pursuing other capital projects. Grant funds may be used for planning, short- and long-term facilities projects, or for the purchase of a new facility.




- For any project that costs more than the allowable grant request amount, the applicant must show their ability to fund the difference.
- Projects with multiple unique sites and different artists must be tied together thematically. The applicant must provide separate budgets and implementation schedules for each unique site.





